



Chapel Bookings Conditions of Use

Booking procedure

Tentative bookings and enquiries may be made by telephoning the College Main Office on 8179 2400. All tentative bookings must be confirmed within 30 days by completing and returning the Application Form in this booklet along with the Booking Fee and Refundable Deposit. Cash, Cheque, Money order, Credit Card are accepted.

Wedding ceremony times

- Saturday and Public Holidays: 11:00am, 1:00pm, 3:00pm and 5:00pm
- Sunday: 3:00pm and 5:00pm

Easter

No wedding ceremonies can be held on Good Friday or Easter Saturday but may be held on Easter Sunday or Easter Monday.

Arrival and departure times

Each wedding ceremony is allocated 1 hour 30 minutes and each wedding party is to move on after this time to allow preparation time for the next scheduled wedding. It is imperative the scheduled time limit is adhered to as not to disrupt or inconvenience the next scheduled wedding. Photographers should be notified of the limited time for photos outside the Chapel.

Seating

The Chapel comfortably seats 180 - 200 people. An area is available in the organ loft for approximately 10 - 12 people for a choir or musicians.

Cost

The booking fee for a wedding ceremony in the Chapel is \$500 GST inclusive plus a \$150 refundable deposit. The booking fee for Old Scholars of Cabra Dominican College is \$400 GST inclusive plus a \$100 refundable deposit. Cancellation of a booking incurs a \$150 cancellation fee.

Refundable deposit

The refundable deposit is to ensure the Chapel and Grounds are left in an appropriate condition and all conditions of use are adhered to.

The following are prohibited:

- The use or throwing of confetti, rice, rose petals and sugar almonds etc.
- A late completion of more than 15 minutes of the allocated/booked time.
- The use of drawing pins, glues or nails for attaching decorations etc. which will damage the Chapel furniture.
- Alcohol on the ground.

A breach of any of these conditions or damage of the Chapel Furniture or surrounds will result in the forfeit of the \$150 refundable deposit.



Wedding policy

All wedding ceremonies are to be conducted by a Roman Catholic Priest or a Registered Minister of Religion. Wedding ceremonies are not to be conducted by a marriage celebrant. It is preferred that one or both of the couple to be married is a Catholic but it is not insisted upon. If the couple belong to a Christian denomination other than Catholic, it is requested you write to the Principal of Cabra Dominican College requesting permission and stating your reasons for wanting to be married in St Dominic's Chapel.

Priest/payment to priest/minister

There is no resident Priest at St Dominic's Chapel. Therefore you must find a Catholic Priest or Minister to perform the ceremony, preferably from your own Parish. There is a fee to be paid directly to the Priest or Minister and this is your responsibility to pay and to discuss with the Priest/Minister.

Rehearsals

Arrangements for rehearsals are to be made by contacting Irena during school term office hours on 8179 2400 at the College.

Parking

Guests are asked not to park in front or in the driveway of the Main Building nor the roadway at the side of the Chapel so that the bridal cars have access to the front of the Chapel and can turn around to be ready for departure.

PA system

The Chapel PA system will be set at the correct level for best use, therefore no adjustment will be necessary. The PA System must not be interfered with and if you experience any difficulty please speak with Irena. If there is need for a CD Player, there is one available for use in the Chapel on request.

Alcohol

No alcohol is permitted in the Chapel or on the college premises.

Miscellaneous

- Altar servers, organists, flowers and decorating of the Chapel and Altar are the responsibility of the hirers.
- Pew bows are available upon request.
- Photographs outside the Chapel are permitted but no photographs are to be taken within the other areas of Cabra Dominican College unless prior arrangements have been made.
- Payment of the refundable deposit does not give you permission to breach the above 'Conditions of Use'. It is your responsibility to ensure that your guests, photographers etc. are also informed of the 'Conditions of Use'.
- Garden weddings are not permitted.

History of St Dominic's Chapel, Cabra Dominican College

Cabra Dominican College was opened in February 1886 and St. Dominic's Chapel, Cabra was opened on 29 April 1917.

Its outstanding feature is the high Altar carved in Italy, of fine white Carrara marble, relieved with inlaid panels of rose and yellow marble. The frontispiece consists of a large panel of white marble divided into three sections. The central panel is decorated with a sculptured relief of The Last Supper. On either side are smaller canopies for the statues of St Dominic and St Catherine of Siena.

The main body of the Chapel is lit by a set of ten striking stained glass windows from the famous maker of stained glass CE Kemp from London. The three windows over Our Lady's Altar in the Sanctuary are also from the same firm. The collection of windows has been pronounced one of the world's finest because all are from the same source.

In 1986 St Dominic's Chapel was refurbished and adapted for more effective use by the College. The building needed extensive repairs and the electrical wiring and sound system were completely replaced. A new colour scheme to blend with and highlight the colours in the High Altar was chosen and as the Stations of the Cross had considerably deteriorated over the years they were also repaired and painted with colours chosen to blend with the new colour scheme. The floor was carpeted and kneelers removed for quiet and comfort. A new lectern was made in keeping with those from 19th Century churches. The Sanctuary was adapted by having the front altar rails removed and the marble used in the new altar. A semi-circular extension from the Sanctuary into the nave was a symbol of integration of priests and people in worship.

The result is a truly magnificent Chapel, completely restored to its former glory to be appreciated as a place of worship and celebration.
